Dear Parents / Carers

It has been another busy week in school with approximately 100 pupils attending from Nursery up to Year 6. I am writing to update you on a few matters:

IMPORTANT - School Lunches

Due to staffing issues in the school kitchen we will be unable to provide the children in school with a meal at lunchtime on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday next week $(18^{th}-20^{th})$. Please provide your child with a packed lunch on each of these days. If your child is entitled to free school meals then you will be reimbursed with a voucher. Our office staff are in the process of signing up for vouchers for those parents whose children are entitled to them. We will send these out to you as soon as we can.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club will continue to run every day next week.

Winter weather

If your child is attending school, please can you ensure that they are wearing wellies, boots or strong shoes as it has been particularly wet and snowy lately. It may also be an idea for children to have a spare pair of tights / socks in their bags in case they get wet feet.

Courtesy calls

Some of our staff have been making courtesy calls to parents to see how the children are managing with their online learning at home and to ask if any help is needed.
