The situation has been reported to Durham County Council and the Traffic Management Team for Durham Constabulary. As the weather improves during the summer months, can we please encourage you and your child to walk to school whenever possible or to park further away from school and walk in. I am forever worried that there will be a nasty accident if this dangerous situation continues.

## LOCAL ELECTIONS – PARTIAL SCHOOL CLOSURE

We have been informed that the school will be used as a polling station for the local elections on Thursday 6 May. <u>We are able to avoid total school closure</u> by restricting public access to only the KS1/ Nursery buildings. This means the school will be closed to all children in Nursery, Reception and Y1 classes. Online work will be uploaded to Purple Mash for that day. Y2 will be in school and will enter and exit by the side gate next to the bungalows for this day only at the normal time of 8.50am. Y3 – Y6 will attend as normal.

Due to the site of the kitchen/dining areas, we will be unable to provide a cooked meal on that day. A school prepared packed lunch will be provided for children in Y2 and those in KS2 who are entitled to free school meals. Children who pay for school meals will need to bring a packed lunch.

Unfortunately, we will not be able to offer Breakfast Club provision either. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause you but it is due to circumstances beyond our control. School will re-open as normal on Friday 7 May.

We would also like to remind parents/carers that the school will be closed Monday 3 May for the May Day Bank Holiday and will break up on Friday 28 May for one week for the Summer Half Term Holiday.
